Improved staff confidence and competence when teaching the PE curriculum.	Staff who took part in the training reported that they felt much more confident to teach multi-skills. Planning, observations and assessment illustrate staff competence.
PE mats	£500	Specialist mats will be purchased to use for whole school PE and extra-curricular club use.	Children will have a safe environment to learn gymnastics, dance and other areas of the curriculum.	Mats comply with regulations and are safe for use with all year groups. The children are now able to get the mats out and put them away independently – a key skill.
